Transfer Students

Students transferring to the district from other districts, either in state or out-of state, will be assigned for grade placement according to recommendations from the schools from which they have transferred; however, the district reserves the right to evaluate each student individually.

Students planning to transfer from the district to another district should notify the principal and superintendent prior to the date of departure so that all required procedures may be completed. Student records will be sent to the school upon the receipt of a request signed by the student's parents or legal guardian if the student is under eighteen years of age, or upon receipt of a request signed by the student if the student is eighteen years of age or older or upon receipt of a request from the school district in which the student seeks to enroll. (See Policy 532, Section 532.6 (a) 7.

Students of other districts transferring to our district will not knowingly be allowed to participate at our district if there is question that they would be eligible. From time to time students or parents of students will try this procedure due to the fact the student would be ineligible at the parenting district. This should never be knowingly permitted when the primary reason is for maintaining the student's eligibility. (See 510.9)

Rationale: Students transferring to CAM High are expected to work for graduation requirements of our school. Credit will be transferred for all passing courses at previous schools attended. Future schedules will be set up assuming the student will graduate from CAM.

CAM Graduation Requirements:

In order to qualify for graduation, all students must earn 56 credits. One credit is earned by satisfactorily completing a course which meets five times every two weeks for one semester (for a minimum of 400 minutes in two weeks).

The required courses are: Two years of science (4 credits); three years of English (6 credits), three years of math (6 credits), one semester of American Government (1 credit), one year of Cultural Geography (2 credits), four years of Physical Education; 1/2 year Practical Arts (1 credit); Fine Arts 1/2 year (1 credit); Economics (1 credit); Health (1 credit); one year of American History (2 credits).

Satisfactory completion of any of the following courses will meet the one credit fine arts requirement.

Art (any)
Instrumental Music (Band)
Vocal Music

Satisfactory completion of any of the following courses will meet the one credit practical arts requirement.

Family & Consumer Science I, II, III	Vo Ag
Child Development	Ind. Arts

The student is reminded that it is his/her responsibility to keep track of the number of credits earned toward graduation. Copies of transcripts are available to students at no cost. Please contact the guidance office for assistance with questions you may have concerning graduation requirements.

Early Graduation: Students meeting all the graduation requirements of the Anita Community School District may graduate before the end of their eighth semester. Any student wanting to exercise this option must meet with the counselor to arrange their schedule and check their status for early graduation. Early graduates will not be able to participate in school activities, Prom, or May graduation ceremony.

In case of incomplete semester work, partial credit will be issued, ie, one quarter's work will result in one/half of a semester's work. Mid-year transfers will be placed in current year requirements, if possible. Credit will be awarded for the part of year completed. State requirements will be completed as soon as possible.
