Hazardous Chemical Risks Right to Know

The Board of Directors recognize the necessity to transmit information by means of a comprehensive hazard communication program, which includes container labeling, material safety data sheets and employee training and to transmit that program to district employees, the community and to Emergency Response personnel.

Therefore, it shall be the policy of the Board of Directors to develop and implement a program to comply with the "Right to Know Law and Rules." The program shall be administered by the Superintendent of Schools or a designee.

Any donated paints, solvents, fertilizers, herbicides, pesticides, and other materials, products, and chemicals should be carefully evaluated by the administration in terms of potential benefit and cost to the school district, considering hazard assessment and waste disposal challenges, before being accepted.
